Goal: Expand the supply of assisted housing

Progress: PHA has continued partnership with a local community action agency and assists in building 6-10 new single-family homes per year. These homes are sold to low-income buyers. In 2024, the PHA has completed construction on a 56-unit apartment and 4-plex development north of Kelley Highway. The 56-unit development was constructed in part with Low-Income Housing Tax Credits and the PHA provided Project Based Vouchers for 42 of the units. The PHA is also working with the local municipality to redevelop a decommissioned water reservoir site into 34 buildable lots to construct affordable homes for sale. The lots are expected to be available to build upon in 2026.

- 13. The PHA will comply with acquisition and relocation requirements of the Uniform Relocation Assistance and Real Property Acquisition Policies Act of 1970 and implementing regulations at 49 CFR Part 24 as applicable.
- 14. The PHA will take appropriate affirmative action to award contracts to minority and women business enterprises under 24 CFR 5.105(a).

 15. The PHA will provide the responsible entity or HUD any documentar on that the responsible entity or HUD needs to carry out its review under the National Environmental Policy Act and other related author ite in accordance with 24 CFR Part 58 or Part 50, respectively.
- 16. With respect to public housing the PHA will comply with D. vis Dacon or HUD determined wage rate requirements under Section 12 of the United States Housing Act of 1937 and the Contract Work Hours and Safety Standards Act.

- covered grant funds only for activities that are approvable under the regulations and included in its Plan.
- 21. All attachments to the Plan have been and vin cor linue to be available at all times and all locations that the PHA Plan is available for public inspection. All required sopporting documents have been made available for public inspection along with the Plan and additional requirements at the Almary business office of the PHA and at all other times and locations identified by the PHA in its PHA Plan and will continue to be made available at least at the primary business office of the PHA.
